Let's Create Jubilee flowers!



We Need:

Jubilee Celebration Rose:

- 3 pink circles cut out from tissue paper (use newspaper if necessary)
- 3 smaller yellow tissue paper circles. (Use newspaper if necessary)
- A pipe cleaner
 (Or use ribbon or string to make a garland).
- 1 pair of scissors



Marigold:

- 4 sheets of tissue paper in orange
- 1 pair of scissors
- A pipe cleaner




William Morris loved to make designs with flowers, such as roses and marigolds. To the left you can see his design titled 'Rose.'

This summer we are celebrating the Queens Platinum Jubilee. Flowers have often been used to celebrate the Queens Jubilee, with some even named after the event itself, such as, a Jubilee

Celebration Rose with its bright pink and yellow petals.

Let's make a Jubilee celebration rose and a marigold!

Let's Start:




Let's make a rose:

- 1. Put the smaller paper circles on top of the larger paper circles.
- 2. Make 2 holes in the centre of the pile, using scissors. A helpful grown-up can do this.
- 3. Thread a pipe cleaner through the holes and twist together.
- 4. Pull up the first circle and squash it together. Repeat with the other circles.

Let's make a marigold:

- 1. Take 4 sheets of tissue paper and fold them backwards and forwards like a concertina.
- 2. Find the middle and cut a V on each side.
- 3. Twist 1 pipe cleaner round the middle.
- 4. Cut fringes at each end.
- 5. Carefully separate the sheets of tissue paper and pull them up into a flower.



Well done you have made a beautiful bright rose and golden marigold!
