Let's make a Mobile!





We need:

- A long stick or branch.
- Pair of scissors
- Colouring materials: pens, crayons or pencils
- Trellis worksheet
- Gluestick or stapler
- Ribbon or wool
- Helpful adult.



Let's begin:

- 1. Ask your helpful adult to print the Trellis template, on page 3.
- 2. Colour the birds, butterflies and roses and cut them out. Cut three lengths of ribbon or wool. They can be the same size or different sizes.
- 3. Stick one end of a ribbon or wool to a bird, and stick the other bird over the ribbon. Stick one end of the next ribbon to a butterfly and stick the other butterfly over it. Do the same with the roses.
- 4. Take the other end of the bird ribbon or wool and attach it to your branch. You can tie it on or make a loop by folding over the end and stapling it. Do the same with the rose and the butterfly.
- 5. Take another length of ribbon or wool and tie it to the branch to make a hanger. Where are you going to place your Trellis mobile?
- 6. William Morris was inspired by his own garden to make his Trellis design. Maybe you can make another mobile inspired by your own windowbox, garden or park.
